
Why?





Smart Villages are **communities in rural areas** that use innovative solutions to improve their resilience, building on local strengths & opportunities.

They rely on a **participatory approach** to develop and implement their strategy to improve their economic, social and/or environmental conditions, in particular by mobilising solutions offered by **digital technologies**.

They benefit from cooperation and alliances with other communities and actors in rural and urban areas.

The initiation and the implementation of **Smart Village strategies** may build on existing initiatives and can be funded by a variety of public and private sources.



Role of research

- Smart Villages offer a wide field of research on variety of topics (depopulation, digitisation, energy, mobility, health, governance, etc)
- Policies post 2020 being drafted (influence this process with evidence-based research): ESIF (EAFRD, ERDF);
 - European Parliament is proposing ringfence 5% of ERDF funds dedicated to objective 1 to be allocated of regions suffering from depopulation, and 17.5% of this to be spent on Smart Villages
 - □ Rural Development Policy (EAFRD) will support the implementation of 'Smart Villages Strategies on the ground'
 - Some Member States thinking of extending the EIP-AGRI model to support Smart Villages → Opportunity to engage researcher with local problems and needs.
